

Rules and Regulations

- (1) Cricklands Limited, nor any of their officers, Servants or Agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage or loss or for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to Exhibitors, Competitors, or members of the General Public or their Servants, Agents or to anyone on the Showground, or for any loss, claim, matter circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of nor attributable or any journey to or from the Show.
- (2) The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry, cancel, or alter classes or postpone the event due to unforeseen circumstances.
- (3) No individual for which he/she is responsible as owner lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete in any competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.
- (4) All riders must wear protective headgear to British Standard (BS EN1384) with fitted secure-chinstrap.
- (5) Whips are permitted in all classes, as are callers.
- (6) Riders are not permitted to erect enclosures in the lorry field for their horses to graze in.
- (7) Schooling of horses and ponies is also not permitted in the lorry field. There are plenty of places that you can exercise your horses, so if you are unsure where these are, please come and ask one of the team.
- (8) If during, or before the competition, the organisers decide that an animal is unfit or lame, it will be withdrawn and retired immediately from the competition.
- (9) A Veterinary Surgeon will be on call throughout the event. Every attempt will be made to ensure that a Farrier is also on call, but riders would be advised to have their horses re-shod no more than 2-3 weeks prior to the event.
- (10) If a competitor receives first aid treatment whilst competing, they will be asked to retire from that class.
- (11) In accordance with Health & Safety regulations, riders must keep to those areas clearly marked for their use. Generally, these are the horsewalks, warming in areas, and the stable yard. Anyone who fails to regard these regulations will be asked to leave the Showground.
- (12) Particular care will be taken to detect any signs of cruelty in any form. In the unlikely event of this occurring, the persons responsible will be ordered to remove the exhibit and themselves from the Showground.
- (13) All dogs visiting the Showground must be kept on a lead.
- (14) Anyone with a Stallion must inform the office at least 14 days prior to the start of the show so that the arrangements can be made for them to go into a stallion box.
- (15) The show organisers reserve the right to exclude from the meeting or remove from the showground any person or property for any reason which they deem appropriate.

Refunds Policy

- (i) Any rider may cancel their entry earlier than one calendar month before the first day of the show. They will be entitled to a full refund less a £10 deposit to cover our administration. Riders may cancel for any reason.
- (ii) Anyone cancelling within one calendar month, but not within two weeks, before the first day of the show is not entitled to a refund. However, if we have a waiting list at the time for their class, and we are able to fill their space, the rider will be entitled to a full refund, less the deposit.
- (iii) No refund will be given within one week before the start of the show.
- (iv) Occasionally, riders may be offered the chance to transfer their qualification to the next Championship event (eg Winter League Finals or the Championships of Great Britain) the following year. However, this remains at the discretion of Cricklands Ltd.
