Overview of your Classes

Once you have sent in your Qualification Card (available from your nearest qualifying venue) and £10 deposit, you will automatically be eligible to compete into each of the following 5 Classes.

DAY ONE: Warm Up Class (morning)

DAY TWO: Warm Up Class (morning) Heat One (afternoon)

Day THREE: Warm Up Class (morning) Heat Two (afternoon)

If you wish to jump in the optional Warm Up Classes, you must have informed the Secretaries Office the previous day.

The deadline for this is 4.30pm, except for the warm up class on Day One, when the office will stay open until 6pm the night before. For those hoping to arrive on Day One, Declarations for the warm up classes that day **MUST** be received by 8am. At that time sheets will be taken away. If you are late, you will miss your chance. Telephone declarations will no longer be accepted.

How to declare for the Warm Up Classes

Important Please Read

Rosettes & Prizemoney

The order that people shall jump in the Semi Finals and Finals Classes will be drawn in the Secretaries Office and shall be displayed on the Notice Board outside the office the night before each of the classes. Each of the five classes has rosettes 1st - 10th together with the following Prizemoney:

£10, £9, £8, £7, £6, £5, £4, £3, £2, £1

The overall winner of each height will be the horse and rider combination with the most points over the final TWO days, not necessarily the person who wins the Final on Day Three. In the event of a tie in points, the rider with the most points from Day Three will be deemed the winner.

Overall Winners

Day ONE

Morning Warm Up

One round, straight against the clock.

Rosettes 1st - 10th Prizemoney £10, £9, £8, £7, £6, £5, £4, £3, £2, £1

Afternoon TEAM JUMPING

Limited number of Teams, first come first serve

Each team is made up of three or four riders. The competition shall consist of two rounds. In the first round, each member of the team jumps but only the best three scores will count. The first rider of every team in the competition will jump first, followed by the second riders. Teams that are clear will then go through to the jump off. Each team has to nominate 2 riders to represent them in the jump off round. Both of these riders' scores and times will be combined to determine the winning Team.

Entry Fee: £40 per Team.

Prizemoney: £40, £36, £32, £28, £24, £20 (per team),

Rosettes 1st - 6th

Morning Warm Up

One round, straight against the clock.

Rosettes 1st - 10th Prizemoney £10, £9, £8, £7, £6, £5, £4, £3, £2, £1

Afternoon HEAT ONE

This class consists of a first round, and then a jump off against the clock. Every clear in the first round will be awarded five 5 points automatically. In addition, the first 10 places will be given points in the following manner:

Day TWO

Morning Warm Up

One round, straight against the clock.

Afternoon HEAT TWO

This class consists of a first round, and then a jump off against the clock.

This time there are no points for clears in the first round. The jump off will be jumped in reverse order of points already earned. The first ten places will be awarded points in the following manner:

1st	150 Points	(& £10)	6th	75 Points	(& £5)
2nd	135 Points	(& £9)	7th	60 Points	(& £4)
3rd	120 Points	(& £8)	8th	45 Points	(& £3)
4th	105 Points	(& £7)	9th	30 Points	(& £2)

Day THREE

Final Presentation

As soon as possible after the last class has finished, the final presentation will take place in front of the office. The overall awards are for the Gold, Silver and Bronze medal positions in each class.

Frequently Asked Questions

What to do now! Find a Qualifying Venue near you. Contact them and ask when they are next running a Qualifying Class. Go to the event and try to get a double clear in any of the different height categories. If you do manage to jump double clear you will be given a Qualification Card. Send this, together with the £10 deposit, to the address on the card and you will be qualified for the Finals. Its as simple as that.

How do I know I'll be good enough? These finals are meant for people like you. Anyone that can jump a double clear at 2'3" / 70cms (or 2'6" / 80cms for the seniors) is able to qualify. Find someone that has already come to the centre and they will tell you that you can be sure that we cater for individuals of all standards. Most people found that, whether you win or not, it really is a great weekend of fun.

It seems like a long way to travel? We are only 8 minutes from the Severn Bridge, with main roads leading virtually right up to the entrance. The Show has been designed for people like you to come and stay over. Why not team up with people from your livery yards or that live near and share a lorry?

I've never stayed away at a show before? Don't panic! Last year saw more first-timers than ever before. The stable is included in the price, as is a space for you tent, caravan, car, jeep or lorry. The food is great value too so you won't get ripped off once you're here!

What do we do once we are there? On arrival to the Showground, you will find your stable number in the display cabinet near the archway. Your stable number is not the same as your running numbers. The Warm Up Classes are all optional, so if you would rather rest your horse or pony you can do. To be entered in the warm up classes you MUST declare in the office. You will automatically be entered for the Finals. Heats 1 and 2 are run in drawn order. This means that the night before the competition, the secretaries of the Show put all the names in a hat and make the order of competing random. This order must be adhered to and no squeezing in is allowed! The jump off in Heat 2 will be in reverse order of points already earned.

What's the rule on BSJA membership? If either riders or horses / ponies are currently registered with the BSJA, they may only compete in the bigger classes. For the Seniors, this is the 3'0" or 3'3", and for Junior it is the 2'9", 3'0" and 3'3". Anyone caught in breach of this rule will be sent home and barred from future competitions.

What do we need to bring with us? You will need to bring all your own mucking out equipment and water buckets. We sell haylage and shaving on site at competitive prices but you may bring your own if you prefer. We do not allow straw or paper in the stables.

Rules and Regulations

General & Legal

(1) Cricklands Limited, nor any of their officers, Servants or Agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage or loss or for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to Exhibitors, Competitors, or members of the General Public or their Servants, Agents or to anyone on the Showground, or for any loss, claim, matter circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of nor attributable or any journey to or from the Show.

(2) No individual for which he/she is responsible as owner lessee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.

(3) The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry; cancel or alter classes or postpone the event due to unforeseen circumstances. The organisers also reserve the right, if necessary, to amend the schedule, which may mean that riders compete in less classes than advertised. In the unlikely event that the event is cancelled, the Organisers will return everyone's monies, less an administration charge of up to 50% of the package price, to cover the irrecoverable costs of preparing to host the event.

Equipment & Horses

(4) All riders must wear protective headgear to British Standard (BS EN1384) with fitted secure chinstrap. Back protectors are recommended for all classes.

(5) All riders must be dressed correctly whilst competing.

(6) Anyone with a Stallion must inform the office at least 14 days prior to the start of the show so that the arrangements can be made for them to be stabled in a stallion box.

(7) If during, or before the competition, the organisers decide that an animal is unfit or lame, it will be withdrawn and retired immediately from the competition.

(8) A Veterinary Surgeon will be on call throughout the event on 01291 650690. Every attempt will be made to ensure that a Farrier is also on call, but riders would be advised to have their horses re-shod no more than 2-3 weeks prior to the event.

(9) Particular care will be taken to detect any signs of cruelty in any form. In the unlikely event of this occurring, the persons responsible will be ordered to remove the exhibit and themselves from the Showground.

Showground Rules

(10) Riders are not permitted to erect enclosures in the lorry field for their horses to graze in.

(11) All dogs visiting the Showground must be kept on a lead.

(12) Grass arenas, including those that are not being used, are prohibited areas for pedestrians and those on horseback. The Derby Bank is included in this ban.

(13) The show organisers reserve the right to exclude from the meeting or remove from the showground any person or property for any reason which they deem appropriate.

(14) Premier Parking, which includes electric hook up, entitles riders to park ONE vehicle in the specified area. Display Cards must be placed in the window of your vehicle for the duration of the show. This vehicle may be a lorry or a caravan. Any additional awning or tents parked in this area will require a Premier Parking Tent Pass, at a cost of £15. No cars, vans or 4x4s will be permitted to park in this area. You may require a long lead (up to 30m) with an outdoor connector, and you must park where asked to do so by our attendant(s). Bookings and payment for this service must be done so in advance.

(15) Stables will be allocated once we receive full payment. Once our own stables are filled, horses will be put into temporary stables. This will incur a further £20 charge to cover our cost of hiring the stabling.

Health & Safety

(16) Bicycles are no longer permitted on the showground. This measure has been put in place for your own safety.

(17) Schooling of horses and ponies is not permitted in the lorry field. There are plenty of places to exercise your horses, so if you are unsure where these are, please come and ask one of the team.

(18) Anyone receiving first aid treatment whilst competing will be asked to retire from that class.

(19) In accordance with Health & Safety regulations, riders must keep to those areas clearly marked for their use. Anyone who fails to regard these regulations will be asked to leave the Showground.

Security

(20) As part of their package, each rider will receive 3 Wristbands, which entitles ONE person entry to the Pavilion and Showground for the event. Further wristbands can be purchased from the Show Office, during opening hours, at a cost of £5 per person. Individuals found without wristbands may be asked to leave the showground.

(21) After 10:30pm, the lorry park should be quiet, no music should be playing and people should be indoors. Once the pavilion has closed, please return to your lorries, caravans and tents as soon as possible and as quietly as possible. Anyone found to be breaking this rule may be asked to leave the showground, and barred from future competitions.

(22) Please keep all property secured when not in use. Generators and bikes in particular should be kept locked up with a chain. All property remains the responsibility of the owner at all times.

Refunds Policy

(23) Any rider may cancel their entry earlier than one calendar month before the first day of the show. They will be entitled to a full refund less a £10 deposit to cover our administration. Riders may cancel for any reason.

(24) Anyone cancelling within one calendar month of the start date of the show is not entitled to a refund.

(25) Occasionally, riders may be offered the chance to transfer their qualification to the next Championship event (eg Winter League Finals or the Championships of Great Britain) the following year. However, this remains at the discretion of Cricklands Ltd, and will be subject to a £25 transfer fee.

(26) No transfers will be given to cancellations within one week before the start of the show.

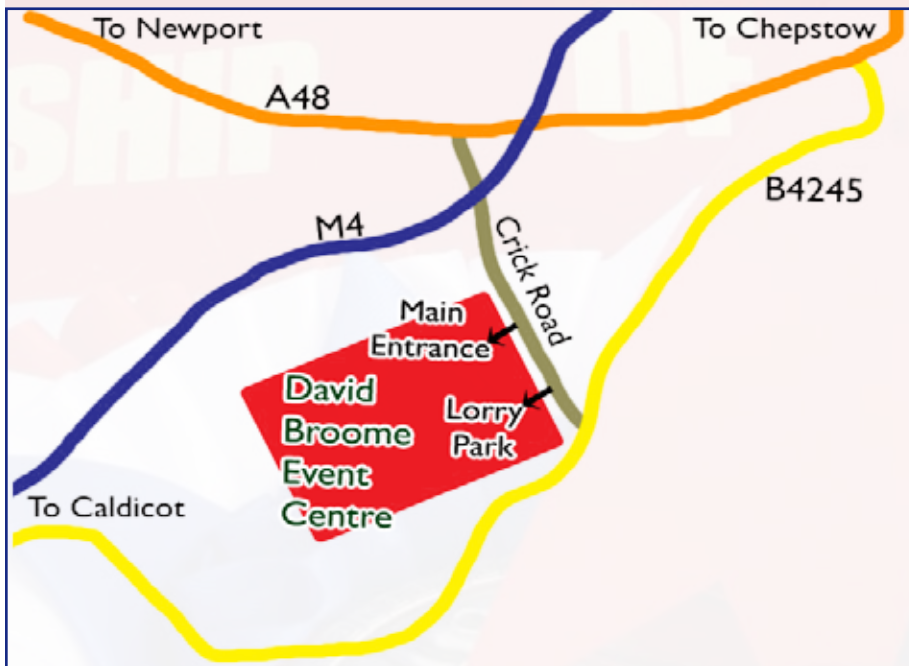
Directions to the Centre

From M4 London:

Off at J21 sign posted "M48 Chepstow / Services" - this will take you over the old Severn Bridge. Turn off at J2 (A466) and take roundabout exit to Chepstow (Welcome to Wales). At next roundabout take left turn sign posted "A48 Caerwent" continue for approximately 3 miles to next roundabout then turn left. Approximately 1 mile later take the first right hand turn. The caravan / lorry field is the second field on your left. The other entrances can be found several hundred meters further down the road.

From M4 Swansea:

Off at Junction 24 to meet "Coldra Roundabout". Take the Langstone turnoff and follow the signs towards Chepstow for 8 miles. Turn right opposite the 4x4 garage, as the dual carriageway ends. The various entrances are about 1 mile up that road on your right.
